

What Must I Do that I Might Work the Work of God?

God is a Spirit and God is the Word. The Word is a Seed. One can only do one thing with a single seed if it will prove to be of any value to him. The one Seed that was promised to all of mankind is the “gift of God” whereby he may receive Eternal Life. God gives Seed to the “sower,” but the gift must be planted, nurtured, grow, and become a fruit-bearing tree or bear grain if the gift will ever be of any value to either the giver or the receiver of the Seed. If the gift is wheat, corn, barley, or some other kind of grain, the “gardener” can produce a harvest of grain, take it to the mill, grind it, and make bread. Man, however, cannot live by bread alone.

The one who has received the gift of the Word (Seed) of Knowledge alone has received a Seed that will be good for bread only. This man works in the field in the heat of the day, year after year, producing more and more Knowledge, but he can never come to the *Knowledge of Truth* by having only Knowledge and being “man” (manna) alone.

Every kind of seed will produce an increase of its own kind. One who plants grain will harvest more grain, and nothing else. The “son-of-man” sowed the Good Seed (which was the grain of wheat) among the tares. (See the parable in Matthew 13:24-43.) This Seed of Knowledge was good for bread only. This man had no wife; therefore he had to work alone and could not beget (sire) any children. The “man” in the parable is the “Seed (or Word) of Knowledge” without *Wisdom* (a wife). The children in the parable are the fruit of the Tree (Wisdom) that carry in their bodies *Understanding*, which is called “the Knowledge of the Holy” -- which is Knowledge on a higher order.

A man working by Knowledge alone -- without God, the Living Word of Wisdom -- is as a man trying to produce children without a wife. He labors all day, trying to get Understanding without going through due process.

A Seed (Word) of Knowledge will produce corn or some other kind of grain by which to make and eat bread that shall become his flesh. Flesh (bread) without a bone structure (Wisdom) has no form. Flesh (Knowledge) with *dry* bones (Wisdom) is a woman whose womb is barren. This man has a “form of godliness,” flesh and bone, but he has no power (Understanding) or Life in himself.

A tree (form of doctrine) and its kind and source (author) cannot be known unless she bear children (fruit) that carry in their bodies the “seed” by which to identify the name (kind) of man to whom she is married. Therefore the kind (nature) and source of either the man (knowledge) or the woman (wisdom) who is taken out of him cannot be known except by their fruit. The fruit of one’s labor tells of his kind, his name, and his nature.

The question, “What must I do that I might work the work of God?” is very easily answered. The short answer is: ***You must have spiritual tools by which to work the work of God, since God is a Spirit -- and you must be God at work!***

One can learn earthly, common knowledge through the avenue of his five senses. By the works of his carnal mind he can find man’s wisdom and get understanding. His knowledge and his application of it will most often lead him into some kind of profession. His wisdom most often will produce in him pride and cunning ways by which to outwit his fellow men. He becomes rich by his own fleshly works and thinks himself to be something, when he is nothing more than *a puff of wind* (a fart) blowing through a

corrupt tree (his bodily form). Although this man will receive honor and recognition from those of like mind, after his demise (and it will come) any memory of him by others will be short-lived.

This man's "religion" is vain, corrupt, perverted, and carnal, and by it he will deceive many. All of his knowledge and ability has been gained through the works of his mortal flesh, his carnal mind (senses), and his own self-righteousness. His disciples and his followers are more puffed up in their vanity than he is. He thinks himself to be wise, but his inequity (self-justification) has separated him from his God -- and he is completely unaware that all of his works will be nothing more than ashes and smoke when he is *cast into the fire for the proving of his works* -- whether they are of man (flesh) or by God (Spirit).

Religion has run its course and the time of its end is now here. Because by it man KNEW NOT God, this form of man's doctrine must now be destroyed and pass away.

The works which are of the flesh are the works of one's mortal senses and by his faculties of reason and logic. That which is of Holy Spirit is Spirit, and it is Holy. One who has the Mind of God (Spirit) will work the work of God (Spirit). One who works the work of God IS God at work!

How then can one be God at work? First, one must KNOW the Word (Knowledge) of God and be able to discern and rightly divide between the Knowledge of God and the knowledge of mortal man. This can only be done by the Spirit of Truth within one's being. One who will believe, receive, and conceive of the true Word of God which is given to him -- and produce out of it the Wisdom of God by the work of the Spirit of God in him -- will bring forth the form of the Doctrine of God (the Tree of Life) and bear the fruit of the righteousness of God by the Spirit that is in him. When the Word (Oracle) of God is fully formed in you, you will be able to know and recognize the spirit of error (the work of man's senses and his doctrine), and the Spirit of Truth (the work of the Mind of God and His Doctrine).

Two cannot walk (work) together except they agree. We are all called to be workers together with God, however most never answer this call. ***One cannot agree with and work with a God they do not know.*** Nor can a man keep and abide by a law he does not know and understand.

In order for one to work the work of God, there are some simple principles that must be applied to his thinking:

- a. He must KNOW the Word of God.
- b. He must understand that "God" is the Word of Truth that is in him and that "God" is the Spirit of the Word by which he does his work. The "Spirit of God" is the Life and Consciousness in the mind (cup) that holds in it the Living Substance of the Word of Truth. This Substance of Life is called "Living Faith."
- c. One must be renewed in the "spirit of his mind" by casting out of his mind and his thinking everything that he has learned through the avenue of his mortal senses. He must only agree with the Knowledge he receives on a higher order -- which always comes by the Spirit through the Word of Wisdom from on High.
- d. He must have an ear to hear the Voice (Word) of God and implicitly trust the Word that he hears in his ear. He must act *without taking thought*, and always agree and be one with what he hears and what he is instructed or inspired to do.
- e. When one's house is no longer divided, he is no longer "double minded." This man is *one with God the Word*, *one with God the Spirit*, and *one with the work of God through the Living Word that is in him by the Spirit (Mind) that he IS*. The work, the Word, and the Spirit (Mind) who does the work are all ONE!

He is now a worker together with (not divided from) God. In this one's Mind there are no more thoughts such as "God and I," or any such ideas or thoughts of there being any but the "ONE" at work or that the "ONE" is anyone but YOU! This ONE Mind knows that he is Spirit and he is Truth. He knows that he is the work of God and that he is GOD AT WORK!

So fly, eagles, fly -- and get busy working the work that is yours to do!
